

Timmins Porcupine Minor Soccer Inc. Constitution

Article 1 – Name & Headquarters

1.1 The name of the organization shall be Timmins Porcupine Minor Soccer Inc., hereinafter referred to as “the Club.”

1.2 The Club is a not-for-profit Ontario corporation.

1.3 The headquarters of the Club shall be located within the geographic boundaries of Timmins, Ontario.

Article 2 – Objectives

2.1 Objectives include promoting and developing soccer, providing recreational and competitive opportunities, fostering sportsmanship and leadership, and developing players, coaches, referees, and volunteers.

2.2 Financial gains shall be used only to advance Club objectives.

Article 3 – Affiliations

3.1 The Club shall be a member of Ontario Soccer and its District Association.

3.2 The Club shall follow all published rules, policies, and procedures of Ontario Soccer.

3.3 The Club may affiliate with leagues and organizations supporting its objectives.

Article 4 – Membership

4.1 Classes include Voting Members (adult players, parents/guardians of minors, directors, referees, coaches, volunteers) and Non-Voting Members (minors).

4.2 Membership may be terminated by resignation, non-payment, conflict of interest, or disciplinary action.

4.3 Discipline follows Ontario Soccer disciplinary processes.

Article 5 – Board of Directors

The Club shall be governed by an elected Board responsible for Club operations and compliance.

Article 6 – Officers

May include President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, and Directors.

Article 7 – Meetings

AGM held annually to review reports, approve finances, elect directors, and amend governing documents.

Article 8 – Committees

Committees may include discipline, finance, coach/player development, and others as needed.

Article 9 – Finance

Club operates as a not-for-profit; no profits benefit members. Annual financial statements required.

Article 10 – Amendments

Amendments require a minimum of 6 active member approval. Notice must be given at least 7 days prior.

Article 11 – Dissolution

Upon dissolution, assets may transfer to another Ontario not-for-profit with similar objectives.
